

PARISH NOTES AND NEWS

'Where do we go from here?"

Following the visit of our friends from Lee Abbey, a Discipleship Course is being planned, using videos, for those who would like to think further about the basic principles of living the Christian life.

Themes will include Faith, a Christian outlook, the Bible, Living in to-day's world, Prayer and the Church. There will be a preliminary meeting on Friday April 2nd at the Rectory at 8 00pm to look at the course and consider possible dates for the meetings. All are very welcome.

The Service will be designed to help us move forward in our Christian lives, and will be open to members of Busbridge, Hambledon and Hascombe Parishes. We are very fortunate indeed to have such an outstanding speaker and team coming, and do hope people will book the date now and plan to be there!
