was well attended and the programme of colour transparencies of local events and scenes proved most enjoyable. We were grateful to Mrs. Adgie who kindly operated the projector, and we thank all who loaned us their transparencies for the occasion.

The next meeting of the Fellowship will be held on Thursday December 9th., at 8.0 p.m., in the Village Hall. A most interesting programme of British Transport and Petroleum Bureau Films has been arranged by Mr. Adgie. Those who were present at a similar evening organised by Mr. Adgie last year will remember the excellent films which were shown. All our readers are warmly invited to join us on December 9th. REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY. We are most grateful to Sir John Wenham who kindly officiated and preached at the Remembrance Service this year. During the service the Legion Exhortation was recited by Major-General J.M.W.Martin, Mr. A.E.Wieler read the Lesson, and Mr.S.Ayling placed the wreath at the War Memorial. The Offerings at all services were for the Earl Haig's Fund, and amount to £29. 4. 11.

The Children's Christmas Toy Service will be held on Sunday December 19th at 10.00 a.m. Children are invited to bring toys which will be sent to Homeless Children in time for their Christmas festivities. The Annual Carol Service will be held on Sunday 19th at 6.30 p.m. When the Choir and Congregation will sing Carols and the Christmas Story will be read by members of our Church. The Annual Meeting of the Ladies Home Mission Union (Church Pastoral Aid Society) was held on October 28th at Tigbourne Court. The Rector opened the meeting, saying we were fortunate indeed to have Miss Coggan as our speaker. Miss Coggan gave a most interesting and inspiring talk. On the theme "Opportunity Unlimited" she portrayed vividly the great work to be tackled in this age of Material affluence and spiritual poverty; and told how the L.H.M.U trained workers to help the clergy in the tremendous task of visiting every home in our huge industrial parishes. Miss J.M. Henman thanked the speaker and Mrs. Elton thanked Mrs. Chapman for so kindly letting us use Tigbourne Court and for supplying tea. The Annual Report showed that Hambledon contributed £90 last year. The membership owing to death, illness and those leaving the parish had dropped to 41, but new members were enrolled at the end of the meeting. The Collection amounted to £12, 9. 0d.
