For the time being we are depending upon voluntary help. We should be most grateful for offers - Fridays or Saturdays for about two hours.

AN EXPERIMENT - ADDITIONAL SERVICE.

Over ten years ago we introduced a new service - "Children's Church" at 10.0 a.m., on the first and third Sundays in the month. This has proved a most valuable introduction. It is our hope that when the children feel too old for that service they will attend the 11.0 a.m. or 6.30 p.m. services with their parents, or on their own.

We have now decided to introduce a service of Holy Communion, as an experiment, at 10.0 a.m. on the fourth Sunday in the month commencing Feb 25th. This will be a "Family Communion", and we will use the New Communion Service - an alternative form which has been authorised for experimental use in the Church of England for a period. All Parochial Church Councils have been requested to discuss this new form of service, and to consider its introduction at all services (H.C.) for a period. We have decided not to replace the present Prayer Book service, but it is suggested that we should experiment with the new service occasionally, and it will therefore be used at 10.0 a.m. on the 4th Sundays. It has

several merits - particularly valuable is the fuller participation in the service by the congregation, and provisions made for alternative forms of przyer. Each member will be provided with a copy of the new service.

It is not our intention that this new service should replace Morning Prayer, but that it should be an additional service to meet a need. No doubt children and young people who have been confirmed, and those who feel too old now for Children's Church will find the New Communion Service helpful.

LENT BEGINS ON ASH WEDNESDAY - February 28th. Details of services during Lent will be ready shortly.
