This is the Church's register of electors, and is the list of those qualified to attend and vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting when the elections take place for the Parochial Church Council, the Ruri-decanal Conference and the Diocesan Conference.

"Persons entitled to have their names entered on the Roll of the parish shall be lay members of the Church of England, of either sex, of seventeen years of age and upwards who are baptised and declare that they are members of the Church of England are resident in the parish, or if not so resident have habitually attended public worship in the parish during a period of six months prior to enrolment; and have signed the form of application for enrolment".

Is your name on the Hambledon Church Roll? If not, and you are entitled to have your name entered, please apply to the Rector (or P.C.C., Secretary) for a form. The Roll will be revised during January.
