

Dear Friends

As we go into the new year, we know, if our trust is in the Lord, that He will go with us, and that He is the Lord of life and of history. This gives us confidence and hope in an uncertain world.

We look forward to the commencement of our new timetable of Sunday Services which starts on January 7th. The Services, which will be at 8.00am. 10.30am. and 6.30pm., are listed on cards. If you haven't had one yet, there are some still available at the back of the Church.

I am very sorry there was some confusion over the time of the mid-morning Service on December 10th, and would like to apologise for the inconvenience that was caused. I hope our new timetable, with all services at 8.00am. 10.30am. and 6.30pm. will be easy to follow. If any changes are to be made, for example at the Festivals, these can only be authorised by the PCC and will be announced in good time in both the Church and the magazine.

As we go into the new year and the new decade, I feel that God is challenging us about our commitment to Christ and His Church. Just as the world around us faces the challenge of secular materialism, so I believe that within the Church of God to-day there is still the challenge of nominal religion. Archbishop William Temple once said: "The Church consists of two groups of people, adherents and possessors". It is the possessors of eternal life in Christ who should be open to hear the call to

serve Christ in the Church and in the community, and to put their God-given talents and gifts at His disposal in response to His love for us.

I believe, too, that God may challenge us in 1990 about our giving to His Church. The Bible presents "tithing" (giving one-tenth of our income or pension to God's work here and elsewhere) as a great blessing, both to the Church, and to those who give in this way. (See, for example, Malachi 3:10).

So we face an exciting and challenging year ahead, and also the call to share our faith with others as the Church enters "the decade of evangelism" which the Lambeth Conference of Bishops has called for. May the Lord help us all to rise to the challenge!


