

ST PETER'S HAMBLEDON: JULY 1985

The Rector writes:

My dear Friends

Pulling into a petrol station some time ago, I was struck by a poster advertising a certain brand of petrol which said, "Fill up and feel the difference". My mind went immediately to that verse in Ephesians 5, in which Paul calls us to be "filled with the Spirit." In actual fact in the Greek it means, "go on being filled with the Spirit". There are many things with which we fill our lives, like eating; drinking; playing; learning; making, creating; sleeping; loving; etc., but surely the paramount need for all of us, if we are to keep going in life, and also if we are finally to arrive in God's heaven, is to "Keep on being filled with God's Spirit".

Too often we dry up, break down and run into trouble because we haven't taken the time to run into the filling station to be filled up with God's spirit through the Means of Grace, i.e. worship; fellowship, Communion; prayer and Bible Study.

Every church is a filling station. Here we are met by the grace and love of God, through Word and Sacrament, through people and through living worship. We have the opportunity to open up the "filler cap" of our hearts and lives to Jesus. He fills us with the power of his Spirit. He helps us to set out again with new hope and new power.

ONE SOLITARY LIFE

Here is a man who was born in an obscure village, the child of a peasant woman. He worked in a carpenter's shop until he was 30 and then was an itinerant preacher. He never wrote a book, never held an office; he never went to college, never put a foot inside a big city (in the modern sense); he never travelled 200 miles from the place where he was born. He never did one of the things that usually accompany greatness. He had no credentials but himself. He had nothing to cope with this world, except the naked power of his divine manhood.

While still a young man, the tide of popular opinion turned against him. His friends ran away: one of them denied him. He was turned over to his enemies. He went through the mockery of a trial and was nailed to a cross between two thieves. While he was dying, his executioners gambled for the only piece of property he had while he was on this earth and that was his coat.

When he was dead, he was taken down and laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

More than nineteen centuries have come and gone and to-day He is the centrepiece of the human race and the Leader of the column of progress.

I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched and all the navies that ever were built and all the parliaments that ever sat and all the kings that ever reigned, put together have not affected the life of man as powerfully as has that one solitary life.
