She will then go to Scotland for a week before going to Lee Abbey where she will be the chief lecturer at two successive Schools from May 31st. to June 13th. Then follow events in Parishes, at Otley in Yorkshire, at Fareham in Hampshire, and then at Guildford from Friday, 3rd., July till Tuesday, 7th July. Apart from the gatherings for which personal invitations are being issued, there will be public meetings or

services conducted by Canon Wallace Bird., Chaplain to the Guild of Health, at St. Saviour's Church, Guildford, on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, July 5, 6 and 7 at 8.0 p.m. at which Mrs. Sanford will speak. This weekend Mission has been arranged by the Guild of Health under the auspices of the Guildford Council of Churches.
