#### "A HAPPY AND BLESSED EASTER TO YOU ALL"

St. Paul wrote, "If Christ be not risen then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain" (I Cor. 15, 14). So the great Apostle brought out the fact that the Resurrection of our Lord is of critical importance to Christians. It is at the very heart of Christianity. If it is not true, then the whole faith, in Paul's words, is "vain".

Thus we come back to the fact of the Cross and the Resurrection again and again. For the sign of our faith is an empty Cross with its constant reminder of Christ's victory over death and hell, and every force of evil.

During Lent we have been seeking to learn more of God's love in Christ Jesus. "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son". "God was in Christ Jesus reconciling the world to Himself". A great mystery surrounds the Cross, but the simple truth we accept is that "It was for us, He hung and suffered there".

To enter fully into the joy of Easter we must prepare for the Festival by remembering the suffering our Lord bore before He rose victorious from the grave. In preparation for Easter Day there will be opportunities for us to do this together. On Palm Sunday evening the Passion Story will be read in a Service of Nine Lessons. On Maundy Thursday evening the Lord's Supper will be celebrated - on the night when we remember its Institution in the Upper Room as a constant reminder of His precious death and passion. On Good Friday morning the Cross will be central in our thoughts during a short morning service. To those who have accepted the Saviour Who died on the Cross, the message of the Resurrection is the joy of the ever present Living Lord.
