Dear Friends

There are 3 matters I would like to mention this time, which I believe are important for us.

Pirst, the church electoral roll. This has to be fully revised this year, which means that everyone who wishes to be on the roll for this year's annual parochial church meeting has to sign a new application form, even if you were on the previous roll. If you have been on the roll, you will receive an application form through the post, or by hand. If you are not on the present roll, but worship at Hambledon, we do hope you will fill in a form - there are some at the back of the church. One has to be at least 16 years old (there is no upper age limit!) and be baptized.

Membership of the roll is important for two reasons: first, it enables you to play your full part in the life of the church, to take part and vote at the AGM, etc. secondly, the roll constitutes the only list of names and addresses of church members that we have, and is therefore vital for our pastoral work and parish visitation. Incidentally, it would be a great help if you could kindly fill in your full address (including the name of your road as well as the house) when you complete the form.

Secondly, home meetings. It is good that there are some groups which meet during the day, but it would be very good if there were one or two more evening meetings, especially during those weeks when there isn't an evening meeting on Wednesday at the Rectory. If you could possibly help, either by opening your home, or by leading a meeting (or both) do please let me know.

Thirdly, we are much looking forward to the visit of the Archdeacon of Surrey, the Ven. John Went, who is coming to our Evening Service on March 18th. I do hope many people will come so that we can give him a warm welcome on his first visit as our preacher.



THE PARABLE OF THE

(Matthew 25: 14-30)

THE end of the financial year will soon be upon us. In looking at this parable, let's ask ourselves how we have used our 'talents' over the past year.

THE SETTING

This story of a master entrusting his property to his servants is well known. However its context in the teaching of Jesus warns us that when he returns, we too will have to account for the use of our 'talents'.

ITS MESSAGE

We learn about:

THE MASTER'S PROPERTY
The servants received five, two
and one talent each. We too are
given different 'talents' by God money, gifts, time or
opportunities. What is crucial,
however, is not the amount, but
how we use what we are given.

How effective are we in using our gifts or responsibilities in the service of God and his Church?

THE MASTER'S APPROVAL
Those servants who doubled their
money were rewarded for their
faithfulness by being given more.
Has this principle of God's work
been true in our experience?

Ask God whether he has more responsibility for you as a leader or member of your church.

THE MASTER'S CONDEMNATION

The third servant is described as 'lazy and worthless'. Although we may feel a certain sympathy for him, the trouble was that he did nothing with his talent. Like him we can make excuses: 'it's not my gift' or 'I have little time or money to give'.

Remember: 'Faith is spelt R-I-S-K!'

For the coming year, think how to go forward in faith with our giving and service. One day God wants to say to each of us, 'Well done, good and faithful servant'!
