ANNUAL CHURCH MEETING. This was held at the Rectory on Thursday, March 15th at 8.0 p.m. - 41 present.

The Churchwardens, Messrs. C.A.Chapman, and C.A.Crouhelm were re-elected. The Rector thanked them for their valued services during the previous year.

The Church Accounts were presented by the Hon. Treasurer, Mr.C.A. Chapman who gave a most helpful commentary on the various details, particularly in reference to The Church Expenses and gifts to Missionary Societies and charities supported by the Parish. Information was given about plans for providing further parking space for cars along the roadway opposite the Church, repairs to the pathway across the Churchyard at the entrance to the Church, and proposed improvements to the pews.

Miss Denny, Free-Will Offering Secretary gave a short report concerning the Fund. There has once again been an increase in contributions, and Miss Denny was warmly thanked for her work.

The accounts were adopted and grateful thanks were expressed to Mr. Chapman for his valued services as Hon. Treasurer. Mr.D.R. Future events were mentioned including the visit to London of Dr. Billy Graham for the Greater London Crusade at Earls' Court, the Confirmation Service which will be at Hambledon on Whitsunday, and the Garden Party to be held on the Saturday before Whitsunday this year.

In conclusion the Rector thanked everyone for their co-operation, and the many kindnesses shewn to him and his wife.
