DR. GRAHAM'S NEXT VISIT TO LONDON

Dr. Billy Graham, the American evangelist, is to return to London in November to speak on "Freedom and faith" at a special meeting to commemorate the 350th anniversary of the sailing of the Pilgrim Fathers to America. It is to be held at the Royal Albert Hall on Monday, Nov. 23, at 7.30 p.m.

Under the joint patronage of Viscount Brentford and Lord Luke, the invitation was extended by an executive committee whose chairman is Maj.-General D. J. Wilson-Haffenden.

HAMBLED ON PARISH COUNCIL

At their last meeting the Council decided to spend £15.0.0. on oxygenating plants for restocking the village pond. Estimates for cutting the grass at Hydestile Playing-field, the area north of the Village Green, and round the Village pond, were accepted. It was also decided to have the ditch which runs into the roadside ditch (north of the Village Green) filled in and piped, making this area easier to mow. It was reported that the time-plate at Great House pillar-box had been replaced. Planning applications as affecting the parish, it was agreed to offer no comment. Correspondence regarding the future of the Hambledon Homes was discussed, and suggestions as to the use of the old workhouse buildings were asked for. The latest map of Commons registration were examined. The change in the hours of polling in local elections was noted. decided to inform the Surrey Co. Council that the Parish Council would be agreeable to help in any way they could, in their scheme to keep open the Rights of Way; at the moment they were glad to report that as far as was known, all the footpaths in the parish were in reasonable condition. A. Marnan Esq. agreed to be Hambledon's representative at the official opening of Cranleigh's swimming pool. It was agreed to discuss the joining of B.A.C.A.N. (aircraft noise) after their report had been circulated. Complaints were received as to the state of the track in front of paddock Close, and rubbish dumped behind Holly Cottages; these were to be investigated. Letter of thanks sent to Mr. Martin, Postmaster, Guildford, for his excellent talk at the A.P.M. Thanks also to those who helped with the refreshments. There was no business arising from the Annual Parish Meeting.

THE SOUTH AMERICAN MISSIONARY SOCIETY

Thanking Hambledon for its contribution to the work, the Financial Secretary writes:

We are very conscious of the support of the Society's work amongst individuals and from parishes throughout the British Isles and in various other parts of the world. It is thrilling to realise that the financial gifts received by the Society are tokens of the prayerful concern and interest of those who send them.

In 1969 the Society's income just covered expenditure, for which we thank God. The income included an exceptionally large legacy, but income from gifts did not rise at the same rate as expenditure has risen,

In 1970 the budget has been kept as low as possible but still represents an increase of 15% on 1969. But costs are still rising; for example we have just been informed that the basic cost of passages between the U.K. and South America are being increased by 20%.

Please pray that the Lord will stir others, besides those who are already partners with us in this work, to help us by prayer and gifts at this time when the opportunities to witness for Christ in Latin America are so great.
