## Election of Churchwardens

The retiring Churchwardens, Messrs. C.A.Chapman and P.E.G. Roderick were unanimously re-elected. Grateful thanks for their services in the past, and their willingness to continue in office, were expressed.

Parochial Church Council Report The Secretary, Mr. T.W. Grillo, gave a brief account of the Council's work during the past year. It had arranged for meetings in connection with Mission Unlimited, discussed the care of the fabric, the repairs to the church organ, parish boundaries, and received reports from the representatives on the Deanery Synod.

Church Finances

The Hon. Treasurer, Mr. C.A. Chapman, presented the accounts for the year ended December 31st, 1973, and stated that the collections in church had increased, as had contributions to the Free Will Offering Fund. The financial situation was most encouraging.

Mr. Chapman was thanked for his valued services in dealing with the finances of the church, and Miss Denny was thanked for her untiring labours in connection with the F.W.O.Fund. It was gratifying to note that we had been able to make considerable increases in our grants to the various missionary societies and charities we support.

behalf of the churchwardens. It was noted that it may be necessary to carry out considerable repairs to the church organ in the near future.

Deanery Synod Report

One of the P.C.C. representatives, Dr.Jack Symonds gave a report of the Synod's work last year.

Proposals concerning Pastoral Re-organisation had been discussed, and these could affect the future of the ministry in Hambledon. Two of our members are serving on the Overseas Committee which seeks to increase interest and support for overseas missions.

Church Fellowship & Women's Fellowship reports were also presented.

#### Rector's Report

This was prefaced by a reference to the debt of gratitude we owe to the church officers. The spiritual life of the parish centres largely round the church services, and we are fortunate in having Mr. Michael Puttock as our organist, and in the help given in our worship by the members of the choir. The services of the lesson readers and sidesmen is much appreciated. Church attendances have been most encouraging in recent months, and Children's Church continues to be a very popular service. The increase in church collections had already been noted by the treasurer. Thanks were expressed for the flower arrangements in the church each week. Visitors frequently remark upon the obvious care and attention which is given to the fabric and cleaning of the church, and our thanks are due to Mr.&Mrs. Harding for their services. The churchyard is also well cared for, and we thank Mr. and Mrs. White. The Rector thanked Major and Mrs. Major for their kindness in allowing us to use their courtyard for car parking, and requested that drivers should use care when parking their cars near the grass verges. Recently we have lost through death one of our former . . . churchwardens, Mr. Sidney Ayling, who had been a

faithful member of St.Peter's Church for many years. He had given devoted service as a church-warden, councillor and sidesman. We also sadly miss the help of Mr. Sydney Frogley, who died last year. He not only acted as a sidesman, but also looked after the ringing of the bell for morning services. The departure from the district of Mr. & Mrs. I.J. Adgie last summer was a great loss to us. They had both served on the Church Council and had helped us in many other ways. They had organised an annual outing for several years with marked success.

Among week-day activities there had been a very live Mission Unlimited Study and Discussion Group. Thanks were due to all who led the sessions and to all who took part in the helpful discussions.

A Young People's Group now meets fortnightly after the Sunday evening service, and we have been grateful to Messrs. Stuart Piggin and John Hamilton for their leadership. We also thank Mrs. Ellingson and Dr. & Mrs. Symonds for their generous hospitality.

The Rector concluded his report by announcing the date for his retirement-July 10th,1974. (He will conduct his last services as Rector on Sunday, June 23rd). It is now well known, he stated, that he would be retiring in the near future, but the actual date for this had only recently been decided. Both he and his wife would find it very hard to be leaving the parish where they have spent seventeen happy years, but this seems to be the right time to hand over to a younger man what is an exceptionally happy sphere for service.
