TRANSPORT TO CHURCH

AN EXPERIMENT.

First Sunday in month for 6.30 p.m. Service.

A leaflet was inserted in the September magazine announcing the arrangements we are making to provide a coach for the evening service on the first Sunday in the month. It is evident, from letters received, that several parishioners will greatly appreciate this provision. It may well be that some of your neighbours who do not take the Parish Magazine will not have heard about the "Church Coach", and your help in publicising this means of transport will be much appreciated.

Brief details are as follows:-

- 1). The coach service will commence on Sunday, OCTOBER 4th. (Harvest Festival).
- 2). Coach will leave Hydestile Cross-roads at 6.0 p.m. and

will then run to Lane End and back to the Church,
picking-up passengers en-route.

The following are suggested stopping places:-

Hydestile Cottages: Potter's Lane; "Private Road";
Merry Harriers: Lane End (Hambledon Homes; (Approx.
6.10 p.m.) Lane End (Nr. Hope Cottage); At Sign-
post to "Post Office"; Village Hall; Beech Hill;
Church Lane; Church (6.25 p.m. approx.).
(These are only suggested stopping places, please
signal coach to stop).

- 3). Contributions towards cost of hire of coach may be
placed in the plate near entrance to the Church
(1/- is suggested).
- 4). Future dates:- Nov. 1st; Dec. 6th.; Jan. 3rd.;
Feb. 7th.; March 7th.; April 4th.; May 2nd.;
June 6th.
Additional coaches may be arranged for special
occasions (e.g. Bishop's visit on Jan. 24th.)
- 5). Messrs. Warners of Milford will provide coach.
(The route is an experiment).

a horticulturist, to his life of service to others, and to his personal testimony to his faith in Jesus Christ.
