#### THE CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL - IMPORTANT:

In accordance with the Synodical Government Measure of 1969, an entirely new Electoral Roll will be prepared in 1972. This means that it will be essential for you, if you wish your name to be on the roll, to send in your application for enrolment before the next Annual Parochial Church Meeting which will be held in 1972. Applications made now will be valid for 1972, and forms are in Church.

All Baptised members of the Church of England who have attained the age of seventeen and reside in the parish are entitled to have their names on the roll. Non-residents may also apply for enrolment if they have habitually attended public worship in the Parish Church in the last six months. The Electoral Roll Secretary is Mr. N. Head of Alpenrose, Hambledon, and forms should be sent to him. Mr. Head will be giving further details in a later magazine.

She stressed how the sharing of troubles - often just the telling them to another person - really lightens the load which has become intolerable. One of the most important parts of the work is maintaining contact with the clients until they can stand alone again. Mrs. Croly did not claim a spectacular success rate, but said that the work was rewarding and needed in the modern world.

Mrs. Weiler thanked Mrs. Croly, after many members had asked questions.
