A COTTAGE FOR RETIRED CLERGY.

Miss E.F.Denny has very generously given Dora Cottage, Hambledon, to the Diocese of Guildford for the use of retired clergymen. The house has been completely renovated and we are glad to know that no time has been lost in finding a tenant. We look forward to welcoming to their new home the Reverend and Mrs.B.M.Alexander of Shamley Green. They hope to move into Dora Cottage early in September.
