LETTER FROM THE PHILIPPINES

Jenny Arden-White writes to thank us for the gift of some £60 which we sent from gifts at Christopher Mabley's organ recital.

"I am writing this primarily to thank all those involved for the money raised at Chris Mabley's organ recital recently. It was such a lovely and welcome surprise, and I can tell you it came at just the right time. We are having to pay for so many things at once, and funds are low.

We have really come here at the right time, and it is very exciting to see how the Lord is working, and how He has been and is answering prayers. The new building which we hoped to have been completed in July is still not finished. We can however see a purpose in this delay. There is real need for a house in Manila for use as a baby nursery and base for children with medical and other special needs, and those waiting adoption. We have been praying in faith for God's guidance over this. Already a deposit has been provided, and we have found a house which seems to be perfect in every way. We are going through legal formalities, and are convinced that the remaining money will be forthcoming. We would appreciate your prayers over this.

Jane and I have learned so much since we arrived on trusting completely in God, and how powerful prayer is. There have been times when we have felt your prayers at home strengthening us, as we have been in some testing situations but have experienced real peace throughout them.

We seem to get more children each week and there are now around sixty, including seven babies, and ranging in age from 3 months to 18 years. They are all so lovely, and are the

friendliest and most welcoming I have met. Groups of young ones have learned to play various instruments, and when they sing Christian songs

it sound really fantastic.

Jane and I are in a small flat close to the home, and are really loving it. It is the rainy season now, and often the road outside disappears into a fast flowing river and we have to roll up our jeans and wade knee deep(or more!). I'll never complain of the rain in England again!

We managed to get a glimpse of the Royal Wedding. It looked wonderful. I'm so glad that

Dave and Linda's wedding went well too.
