As part of the celebrations of the 750th anniversary of the church of St Mary the Virgin, Frensham, there will be a Flower Festival and Craft Exhibition on


9th and 10th September 1989.

# LIFE RETURNS TO ETHIOPIAN RIVER BASIN



The EEC has endorsed a reforestation scheme in Ethiopia sponsored by Tear Fund, by granting a further £85,000 to ensure the scheme continues.

The EEC co-funded the original £250,000 project in 1983. Since then three-quarters of a million trees have been planted along an 18km. stretch of the Bilate River Basin.

Dr Mulatu Baffa of the Ethiopian 'Word of Life' Church has played a key role in the scheme. His report shows how quickly a 300 metre strip of young forest can have an impact on the land:

"The river basin was arid semi-desert, yet the area is starting to turn green and the whole ecological system is changing. Wildlife has been attracted back, and the trees, already a valuable stop to further soil erosion, will provide suitably rationed firewood supplies".

### DHSS \* EARLY RETIREMENT

If you are thinking of retiring from work before reaching your 65th birthday (men) or 60th birthday (women) you may like to find out what percentage of pension you have earned so far and what you can expect to get when you reach retirement age. If so, you will need form BR19 which you can get from your local DSS office or by ringing our Freeline service on 0800 666 555. Your call will be free and our staff will be able to answer any query you may have regarding this or any other Social Security benefit.

## INCOME SUPPORT \* EXTRA HELP FOR PENSIONERS

For those who already receive the means tested benefit Income Support, there will be extra help from the beginning of October if you are in one of the following groups:- 75-79 years old, 80 and over, or if you are disabled and 60 years or over. Single people will receive an extra £2.50 and a couple £3.50.

There will also be extra help for those receiving Housing Benefit in the above groups.
