The Assistant Bishop of Guildford, the Right Rev. B. M. Dale, consecrated the new extension to the burial ground after the morning service on Sunday, May 5th. The Lessons were read by Mr. D. Hampden Parker and Mr. David Gibbes. We were delighted to have with us on this occasion Mr. and Mrs. Eric Parker who have given the new land in memory of their daughter. They are also planting ornamental trees in her memory, and have built the extension to the stone boundary wall in memory of the late Mr. Eric Parker of Feathercombe. We are indeed grateful to them for their gifts.

ANNUAL VESTRY AND PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETINGS.

These were held at the Rectory on March 28th. Messrs. C. A. Chapman and S. Ayling were re-elected Churchwardens for the ensuing year and were thanked for their past services. The parochial representatives of the laity were elected to the Church Council. The names are given in this magazine. The Rector thanked the members of the Church Council, the church officers and all who have helped in the work of the Church for their valued service and support in the past year.

The Hon. Treasurer, Mr. C. A. Chapman, submitted the Church Accounts which were approved by the meeting. The Free-Will Offering Fund and Church Collections had increased and we had been able to send increased contributions to Home and Overseas Missions and to a number of charitable organisations. Details of these contributions are included in this magazine. Mr. Chapman, Church Treasurer, and Miss E. F. Denny, F.W.O., Secretary and Treasurer were thanked for their work for the parish. Mr. Marriage was thanked for his services as Hon. Auditor.

The Sidesmen were re-appointed and several new names were added to the list. Mr. C. A. Chapman, on behalf of the Churchwardens presented the report on the fabric of the church. He stated that the Architect had recently inspected the Church (Inspection of Churches Measure) and had given a very satisfactory report.

HAMBLEDON ANNUAL PARISH MEETING REPORT.

Held on Tuesday, May 19th, 1963. D.E. Head Esq., in the Chair. About 33 parishioners present. The Chairman reported that the acceptance of Rock Hill by the Surrey County Council was in its final stage. Miss Denny was thanked for all the time and trouble she had taken over this project. It was also reported that the Bus Shelter in New Road was in use. A grant of £25 was being made towards the cost of upkeep of the Churchyard. Plans for dealing with the corner at Lane End were in the hands of the District Surveyor. It was hoped that the cars at Orchard Farm would be removed in the near future. The Village will enter the Best Kept Village Competition for 1963, and it is hoped that all villagers will give their co-operation in this. Mr. Head congratulated, on behalf of the meeting, Mr. A.C. Main upon his election to the Chairmanship of the Hambledon Rural District Council.

After the business of the meeting there was a very interesting discussion, entitled "Responsibility to the Community", between Mr. Gordon Humphrey, Headmaster of King Edward's School, Witley, and Mr. David Hoad, History Master at the school. Brigadier L. Wieler proposed a vote of thanks to the visiting speakers. Refreshments were served at the close of the meeting.
