## RECTOR'S LETTER

My dear Friends,

# Lent Services at Hambledon

Details of the arrangements for the services and preachers during Lent were given in the leaflet which was included in the February issue of the magazine, and there are spare copies of the leaflet by the font at church. We hope that you will make every effort to attend the services every Sunday so that we may all be drawn closer to Jesus Christ in the fellowship of His Church.

#### The Wider Vision

One of the privileges of our membership of the Christian Church is the sharing with others of the blessings we receive. We have, therefore, included in the programme for the Sundays in Lent some reminders of the missionary activity of the Church both at home and abroad. Our preachers on Sunday, March 2nd, will be speaking about the work of the Church Pastoral-Aid Society, which helps to provide the needy parishes in this country with assistant clergy and lay workers. Lt.-Col. B. Blackburne-Kane will preach at the morning service on Sunday, March 16th, and will tell us about the work in our own Diocese, with special reference to the need for us to support the Bishop's Challenge Fund. This Fund assists many parishes in the Diocese by augmenting the stipends of clergy. Many of our readers may not be aware of the fact that Hambledon has, for a number of years, received considerable financial assistance from the Diocesan Board of Finance. At the evening service on March 16th, there will be an illustrated address about the work of the Church in Mindoro, Philippines. Kodachrome slides will be shown, and an address (recorded) will be given by Dr. Jim Broomhall, who has undertaken pioneer missionary work in the Philippines in connection with the China Inland Mission.

### Easter Communion

Lent is a preparation for the celebration of the greatest Festival of the Christian Church—Easter. On Easter Day there will be celebrations of the Holy Communion at 8.0 a.m. and after both Morning and Evening Prayer. It should be possible for every communicant in the Parish to be present at one of the services of Holy Communion. If there are any parishioners, or members of the congregation, who, owing to sickness or infirmity, are unable to attend church and would like to have Holy Communion in their homes. I will be pleased to visit them for this service. I should be grateful if I may have the names and addresses of any who desire to have Holy Communion in their homes this Eastertide, or at any other time.

There will be a service of Holy Communion in church on Maundy Thursday (April 3rd) at 8.0 p.m. It was on the Thursday night before the first Good Friday that Jesus gathered His disciples together in the Upper Room for the institution of the Lord's Supper, and it is, therefore, most fitting that Christians should meet for that same service on "the night in which he was betrayed." There is no need for me to stress the importance to the Christian of keeping Good Friday as a Holy Day. It has been the custom at Hambledon to have only one service on Good Friday—at 11.0 a.m. At that service we will once again turn our thoughts to Calvary and ask God to reveal afresh to us the wonder of our Saviour's love in dying for us on the Cross.

"Keep, oh! keep us, Saviour dear, Ever constant by Thy side, That with Thee we may appear At the eternal Eastertide."
