A MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR.

First of all a most sincere "thank-you"
 for your generous and warmhearted Easter

Offering. We do appreciate all your many kindnesses to us.

The Festivals of the Christian Year keep us mindful of the great facts of our Faith. At Christmas we remember that God took our flesh and came and dwelt among men, not only to be their perfect Example, but, above all, to be their Saviour. In Lent, and on Good Friday, we meditate upon what it cost God to redeem mankind, and at Easter we celebrate His triumphant rising from the dead, and rejoice in that He ever lives, and is ever with us now. Ascensiontide reminds us, however, that He did not remain here in human form, but "Ascended into Heaven", henceforth exalted in majesty, and one day returning in glory. The Whitsuntide Message reveals to us how Christ is with us now - by His Holy Spirit. That God deigns to indwell us and to let His Power flow through us. It is with regret that we announce the death in her 94th year of Miss Alice Jeffery, of 'Silver Birches', Wormley, and formerly of 'Furze Hill', Hambledon (now 'Beech Hill'). Miss Jeffery had been a patient at Pyrford Hospital for several weeks before her death, and for a number of years had been confined to her room. She always took a deep interest in the life of the village and church, and regularly had her service of Holy Communion.
