POST-WAR NEEDS.

Extracts from Letter of the Bishop.

"What is my Challenge? It is to equip the Church to do its work for God and man in the years that lie ahead. This will not be done apart from a greater sense of responsibility towards others at home and overseas, who need the help of God as we need it. But equipment also means man and woman power and material. To provide this we aim at raising in this Diocese £1,000,000 during the next ten years. As the leader of the Church in the Diocese I appeal to all men and women of good will to assist me to raise this sum of money."

Every Parish in the Diocese will be visited by the Director or his deputy who will preach on a Sunday and hold a meeting for Parishioners on one weekday during the week. The Director himself proposes to come to Hambledon, Canon Eric Southam. He will preach in our Church at the Morning Service on November 12th.
