RECTOR'S LETTER

My dear Friends,

Harvest Festival

The services of Thanksgiving for the Harvest will be held on the first Sunday in October (4th), and this year we have much cause for thanksgiving. The church will, as usual, be decorated on the Saturday morning, and we should be grateful if gifts of fruit, flowers, vegetables, eggs and other suitable tokens could be sent to the church on the Friday, or early on the Saturday morning. Children are asked to bring gifts to the Children's Service at 10 a.m. on the Sunday.

Confirmation Service

Thirteen candidates for Confirmation are attending the preparation classes, and Bishop B. M. Dale, the Assistant Bishop of Guildford, will be confirming them in the Parish Church on Sunday, October 18th, at 6.30 p.m. The last Confirmation Service to be held in Hambledon Church was conducted by Bishop Golding-Bird in June, 1948. The visit of Bishop Dale will, therefore, be a particularly important and memorable occasion for Hambledon. We would commend to your prayers the young people who will at that service be making for themselves the vows and promises made in their names by their godparents at their Baptism. Pray that their Confirmation Day will be to them a time of special blessing. I would suggest that all who have been confirmed should be present with us to make the service a time of personal re-dedication to God's Service.

Church Fellowship

We had arranged to re-open the Fellowship on the second Thursday in October, but as the General Election has now been fixed for that day we have decided to postpone the Fellowship meeting until the second Thursday in November (12th), when our speaker will be Mrs. Julian Haviland. She will speak about her work among refugees and we look forward with particular interest to her visit. This year and the early part of next year is being observed as "World Refugee Year," and I am glad that we are able to devote one evening of our Fellowship to hearing about this important subject from one who has first-hand experience of work among the refugees. What we hear that evening will give us cause to thank God for our own good fortune in being allowed to live in freedom in our own country, and, no doubt, we will feel urged to take a keener interest in what others are doing in our name to alleviate the suffering and hardship of refugees. The Fellowship meetings are open to all members and friends of our church.
